Summer Painting Ideas:

1. Put a long piece of bulletin board paper outside on a fence or wall. Place pans of different colored paint in front of the paper. Use "Koosh" balls, put in the paint and throw at the paper. Makes a great design and oh, what fun!
2. Cut out a large piece of paper and put it in the bottom of a small, plastic pool. Dip golf balls into different colors of paint (in pans). Put balls in the pool. Let children slightly lift the sides and watch the balls roll around as they "paint" the paper. Cool!
3. Hang a long piece of paper on a fence or wall outdoors. Give the children bottles of colored water and let them squirt the paper. Let them have lots of fun as they spray primary colors to make secondary colors. For example, spray blue and yellow to make a beautiful green design.
4. Either indoors or outdoors, sprinkle unsweetened Kool-aid on a piece of paper. Let the children move a piece of ice over the Kool-aid. Watch as the Kool-aid turns to liquid and make a yummy smelling picture. Oh, so Kool!
5. Sand Box Surprise painting: Have children spray the sand in the sand box....it will change color until they shovel it up. This always amazes children.
6. Blueberry painting: July is national blueberry month. Give your children blueberries to look at, touch, smell and taste. After the children have observed the blueberries, add a little water to them and cook them in the microwave for one minute (only the teacher uses the microwave). Have the children help you smush them up. Use the blueberry juice to paint a beautiful blueberry picture. How berry sweet!
7. Squiggle Designs: Give each child a piece of wax paper. Have children make squiggles and different designs with the glue. Then sprinkle the glue with colored sand. After the glue dries (overnight), peel the design off the waxed paper. Hang the creations around the room. Sticky pleasure!
8. Fly Swatter Painting: Hang a long piece of bulletin board paper on a fence or wall. Have the children place new, clean fly swatters into pans of paint and swat the paper. This is a favorite activity for children. What a hit!
